FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Pattern #16275 – ORA1	1/4 yard
16275 – DKGRE1	1/4 yard
16276 – ORA1	1/2 yard
16276 – GRE1	3/4 yard
16276 – YEL1	7/8 yard
16277 – BLA1	1/2 yard
16277 – DKORA1	1/3 yard
16277 – DKGRE1	1/8 yard
16277 – YEL1	1/4 yard
16278 – BLA1	1/2 yard
16278 – ORA1	1/4 yard
16278 – GRE1	3/4 yard
16278 – YEL1	1/4 yard
16279 – DKORA1	1/4 yard
16279 – DKGRE1	1/4 yard
Batting	54" x 54"
Backing	3 yards of your choice
Buttons	4 black 1" buttons 8 orange 1/2" buttons

DIAGONAL CORNER TECHNIQUE

This method is used in the piecing directions that follow. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of a small square. Place right sides together on a larger square or rectangle (Figure a). Stitch on the diagonal line. Trim to a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam toward dark fabric (Figure b). All seam allowances are 1/4".

CENTER PUMPKIN BLOCK

Pattern #16276 – ORA1

(Halloween word toss):

Cut one 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square (A)

Pattern #16277 – DKGRE1 (dots):

Cut one 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle (B)

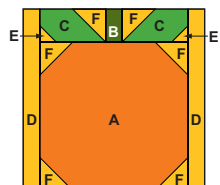
Pattern #16278 – GRE1 (zigzags):

Cut two 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles (C)

Pattern #16276 – YEL1 (Halloween word toss):

Cut one 1 1/2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into two 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" D rectangles and two 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" E squares.

Cut one 2 1/2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into six 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" F squares.



Finished block size: 11"
Make one.

1. Diagonally sew four 2 1/2" F squares to the 9 1/2" A square (Figure 1). Trim and press seams toward orange fabric (Figure 2).

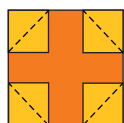

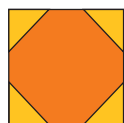

Make one.

2. Diagonally sew two 2 1/2" F squares to the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" C rectangles (Figure 3). Trim and press seams toward green fabric.

Make one left & one right.

3. Diagonally sew two 1 1/2" E squares to the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" C rectangles from Step 2 (Figure 4). Trim and press seams toward green fabric.

Make one left & one right.

4. Sew a 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" B rectangle between the leaf units (Figure 5). Press seams toward B.

5. Sew leaf unit to top of pumpkin unit. Press seam toward pumpkin. Sew the two 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" D rectangles on each side of block. Block should measure 11 1/2" x 11 1/2".

CAT BLOCKS

Pattern #16276 – YEL1

(Halloween word toss):

Cut three 1 1/2" x 42" strips. Crosscut into

eight 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares (A),

four 1 1/2" x 4" rectangles (D),

four 1 1/2" x 7 1/2" rectangles (L), and

four 1 1/2" x 11 1/2" rectangles (M).

Cut one 1" x 42" strip. Crosscut into

four 1" x 3 3/4" rectangles (C).

Cut two 4" x 42" strips. Crosscut into four 4" x 6 1/4" rectangles (F)

and four 4" x 5" rectangles (G).

Cut one 3 1/2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into four 3 1/2" x 6" rectangles (J).

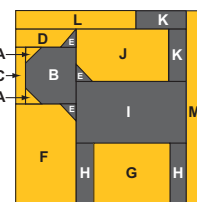
Pattern #16277 – BLA1 (dots):

Cut two 1 1/2" x 42" strips. Crosscut into twelve 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares (E),

eight 1 1/2" x 4" rectangles (H), and eight 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles (K).

Cut one 3 1/2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into four 3 1/2" x 3 3/4" rectangles (B).

Cut one 4" x 42" strip. Crosscut into four 4" x 7" rectangles (I).



Finished block size: 11"
Make two facing left & two facing right.

1. Diagonally sew two 1 1/2" A squares to the 3 1/2" x 3 3/4" B rectangles with the A squares on the 3 3/4" edge (Figure 6). Trim and press seams toward dark fabric. Sew 1" x 3 3/4" C rectangles to each head (Figure 7).

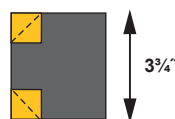

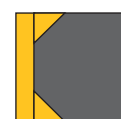

Make four.

2. Diagonally sew 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" E squares to the 4" x 6 1/4" F rectangles (Figure 8). Trim and press seams toward dark fabric. Sew to bottom of each head section from Step 1 (Figure 9).

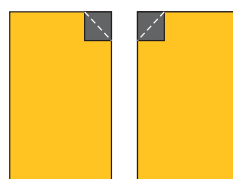

Make two left & two right.

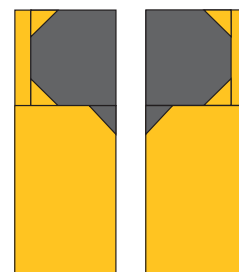


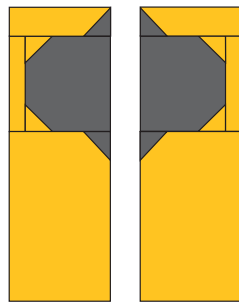

3. Diagonally sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " E squares to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4" D rectangles (Figure 10). Trim and press seams toward dark fabric. Sew to the top of the head section from Step 2 (Figure 11).



Make two left & two right.



Make two left & two right.

4. Sew two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4" H rectangles to each 4" x 5" G rectangle. Press seams toward dark fabric. Sew 4" x 7" I rectangles to top of each leg section (Figure 12). Press seam toward body.

Make four.



5. Diagonally sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " E squares to the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" J rectangles (Figure 13). Trim and press seams toward dark fabric.



Make two left & two right.

6. Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " K rectangle to each rectangle from Step 5 (Figure 14). Press seams toward dark fabric.

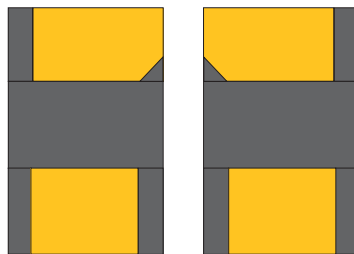


Make two left & two right.

7. Sew sections from Step 4 (Figure 12) and Step 6 together (Figure 15). Press seam toward body.

8. Sew sections from Step 3 (Figure 11) and Step 7 (Figure 15) together.
9. Sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " L rectangles to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " K rectangles. Press seams toward dark fabric. Sew to the top of each cat and then sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " M rectangles to the side of each block (Figure 16). Blocks should measure $11\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ ".

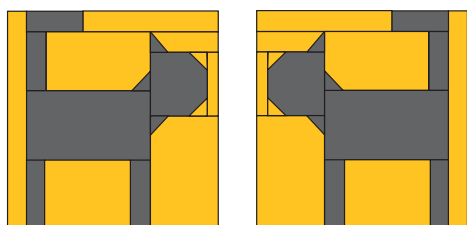

LARGE APPLIQUÉ BLOCKS

Pattern #16276 – GRE1 (Halloween word toss):

Cut four blocks $11\frac{1}{2}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Pattern #16277 – BLA1 (dots): Bat body

Pattern #16278 – BLA1 (zigzag): Bat wings

1. Prepare sixteen bats using your favorite appliqué technique.
2. Iron $11\frac{1}{2}$ " squares in half diagonally twice. Position four bats in each block as shown.
3. Hand or machine appliqué.



Finished block size: 11"
Make four.

ASSEMBLE QUILT TOP

1. Sew blocks together in rows as shown (Figure 17). Press seams in opposing directions. Quilt top should measure $33\frac{1}{2}$ " x $33\frac{1}{2}$ ".

FIRST BORDER

Pattern #16277 – DKORA1 (dots):

Cut two 2" x $33\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Cut two 2" x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

1. Sew 2" x $33\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to top and bottom of quilt top. Press seams toward border strip (Figure 17).
2. Sew 2" x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to sides of quilt top. Press seams toward border strip (Figure 17).

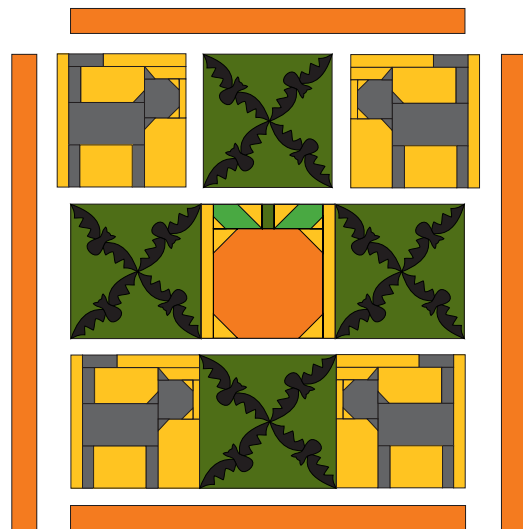

BORDER BLOCKS

Pattern #16276 – ORA1

(Halloween word toss):

Cut one 5" x 42" strip. Crosscut into four 5" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " A rectangles.

Pattern #16277 – DKGRE1 (dots):

Cut four 1" x 2" B rectangles.

Pattern #16278 – GRE1 (zigzag):

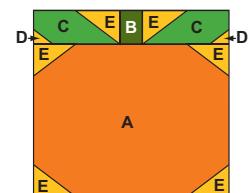
Cut one 2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into eight 2" x $3\frac{1}{4}$ " C rectangles.

Pattern #16276 – YEL1 (Halloween word toss):

Cut one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strip. Crosscut into eight $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " D squares.

Cut one 2" x 42" strip. Crosscut into twenty-four 2" x 2" E squares.

1. Diagonally sew four 2" E squares to the 5" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " A rectangle (Figure 18). Trim and press seams toward orange fabric (Figure 19).



Finished block size: 6"
Make four.

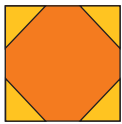

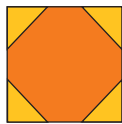

Make four.

- Diagonally sew two 2" E squares to the 2 x 3¼" C rectangles (Figure 20). Trim and press seams toward green fabric.

Make four left & four right.

- Diagonally sew two 1½" D squares to the 2" x 3¼" C rectangles from Step 2 (Figure 21). Trim and press seams toward green fabric.

Make four left & four right.

- Sew a 1" x 2" B rectangle between the leaf units (Figure 22). Press seams toward B fabric. Make four leaf units.

- Stitch leaf sections to tops of pumpkin sections. Press seams toward pumpkins. Make four 6½" x 6½" corner blocks.

SMALL APPLIQUÉ AND SPACER BLOCKS

Pattern #16277 – YEL1 (dots):

Cut one 6½" x 42" strip. Crosscut into six 6½" x 6½" squares.

Pattern #16278 – YEL1 (zigzag):

Cut one 6½" x 42" strip. Crosscut into six 6½" x 6½" squares.

Pattern #16275 – ORA1 (owl and pumpkin toss):

Cut three 6½" x 6½" squares.

Pattern #16275 – DKGRE1 (owl and pumpkin toss):

Cut three 6½" x 6½" squares.

Pattern #16279 – DKORA1 (pumpkin and cat toss):

Cut three 6½" x 6½" squares.

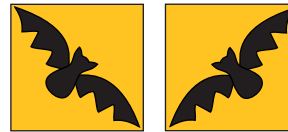
Pattern #16279 – DKGRE1 (pumpkin and cat toss):

Cut three 6½" x 6½" squares.

- Prepare twelve more bats from the remaining black stripes and dots.

Bat Appliqué 100%
Bat should measure
7⅞" wingtip to wingtip.
Make twenty-eight.

- Appliqué six bats on Pattern #16277 – YEL1 squares with bats flying to the right (Figure 23). Blocks should measure 6½" square.
- Appliqué six bats on Pattern #16278 – YEL1 squares with bats flying to the left (Figure 23). Blocks should measure 6½" square.



Finished block size: 6"

Make six right. Make six left.

- Referring to the photo, assemble two side border strips and the top and bottom border strips, alternating three bat blocks and three spacer blocks for each strip. Press seams open.
- Sew two border strips to top and bottom of quilt. Press seams toward first border.
- Sew pumpkin blocks to each end of the remaining border strips. Sew border strips to sides of quilt. Press seams toward first border. Quilt should measure 48½" x 48½".

FINISHING QUILT

Pattern #16278 – GRE1 (zigzag):

Cut as many 2½" bias strips as needed to equal at least 204" for binding.

Pattern #16278 – ORA1 (zigzag):

Cut four 4½" x 4½" squares for bow ties.

- Prepare backing with horizontal seam to measure 54" x 54".
- Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste layers together.
- Hand or machine quilt.
- Join binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Bind using your favorite method.
- Embellishing:
 - For bowties, fold 4½" x 4½" squares in half with right sides together. Sew around all edges leaving 1" opening in the middle of the longest edge (Figure 24). Turn right side out.

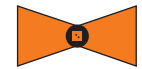

- With needle and thread gather the center of the rectangles. Sew double-stacked 1" black and ½" orange buttons on each bow tie (Figure 25). Hand sew bow tie at the center of each cat's neck.
- For cats' eyes, sew one ½" orange button on each cat's head.



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
