### **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (3716-44 Santa - Beige):

• Fussy cut (5) 4 ½" squares, each centered on a Santa.

#### Fabric B (3713-90 Texture - Gray), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### Fabric C (3717-88 Lights - Red), cut:

• (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

#### Fabric D (3720-99 Words - Black), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric E (3714-99 Star - Black), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric F (3713-44 Texture - Beige), cut:

• (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

#### Fabric G (3715-89 Stripe – Multi), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric H (3717-90 Lights - Gray), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

#### Fabric I (3720-88 Words - Red), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric J (3712-44 Cars Allover - Beige), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8 ½" squares.

#### Fabric K (3718-90 Novelty Stripe - Gray), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x 44 ½" LOF strips.

#### Fabric L (3714-88 Star - Red), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Backing (3719-44 Snowglobe - Beige), cut:

• (2) 60" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 60" x 60" for the back.



## **Sewing**

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Block Assembly**

- 1. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times$   $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, lengthwise. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each end of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times$   $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) A block (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (5) A blocks total.
- 2. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) A block lengthwise. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each end of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the A block to make (1) Block One (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (5) Block Ones total.
- 3. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J square. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each end of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric J square to make (1) Block Two (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Block Twos total.
- 4. Sew (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G squares and (3)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strips together end to end and alternating them to make (1) sashing row. Repeat to make (4) sashing rows total.



#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 5. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, (1) Block One, (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two, (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip together, in that order, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 6. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric F strip, (1) Block One, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric F strip together, in that order, to make Row Two.
- 7. Sew the (4) sashing rows and (3) rows, in numerical order, together, alternating them, to make the Center Block.


8. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to each end of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

#### Layering, Quilting and Finishing

9. Press the quilt top and 60" x 60" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

#### **Binding**

- 10. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric L binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 11. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
