Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (2931-88 Dogs – Red), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 54 ½" LOF strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (2) 6 ½" x 54 ½" strips.
- (6) 4 ½" squares from the remaining fabric.

Fabric B (2935-16 Dog Leash Stripe – Turq.), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric C (2937-16 Tone on Tone – Turq.), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric D (2933-88 Dog Toys – Red), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric E (2936-90 Paw Prints – Gray), cut:

- (12) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (192) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (2934-99 Dog Tags – Black), cut:

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (100) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric G (2932-86 Dog Patch – Multi), cut:

- Fussy cut (6) dog heads, each approximately 2 ½" square.

Fabric H (2936-99 Paw Prints – Black), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut into (12) 2" x 2 ½" strips.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut into (12) 2" x 5 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips and (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.

Fabric I (2937-64 Tone on Tone – Lime), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut into (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric J (2935-88 Dog Leash Stripe – Red), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (2) 2 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" strips.

Fabric K (2936-88 Paw Prints – Red), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (2936-90 Paw Prints – Gray), cut:

- (2) 62" x WOF strips. Piece the strips and cut the 62" x 74" backing.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

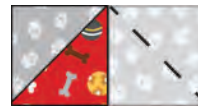

2. Place another $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the right side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) EDE unit.

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (48) EDE units total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips and (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C squares to make (24) CBC units (Fig. 5).

5. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strips and (96) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E squares to make (48) ECE units (Fig. 6).

6. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (24) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips and (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I squares to make (24) IBI units (Fig. 7).

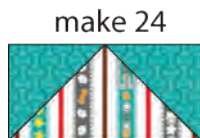

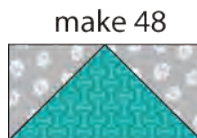

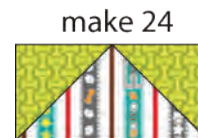

7. Follow Figure 8 and sew (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares, (8) EDE units, (4) CBC units and (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square together to make (1) Block One. Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

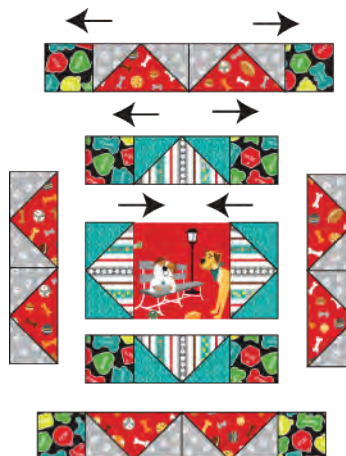

8. Sew (1) 2" x 2 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric G square. Sew (1) 2" x 5 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Block Two center (Fig. 9). Trim the block to measure 4 ½" square. Repeat to make (6) Block Two centers total.

9. Follow Figure 10 and sew (8) 2 ½" Fabric F squares, (8) ECE units, (4) IBI units and (1) Block Two center together to make (1) Block Two. Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

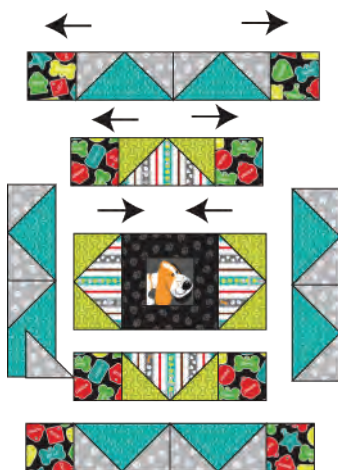

Quilt Top Assembly

10. Sew (1) Block One to each side of (1) Block Two to make Row One (Fig. 11). Repeat to make Row Three.

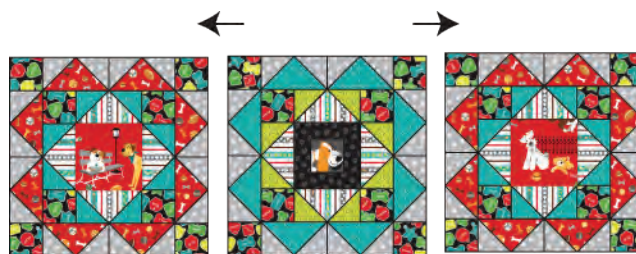

11. Sew (1) block Two to each side of (1) Block One to make Row Two (Fig. 12). Repeat to make Row Four.

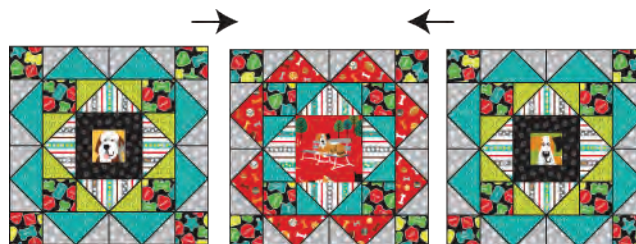

12. Sew the four rows together, in numerical order, to make the quilt top (Fig. 13).

13. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each end of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top (Fig. 14).

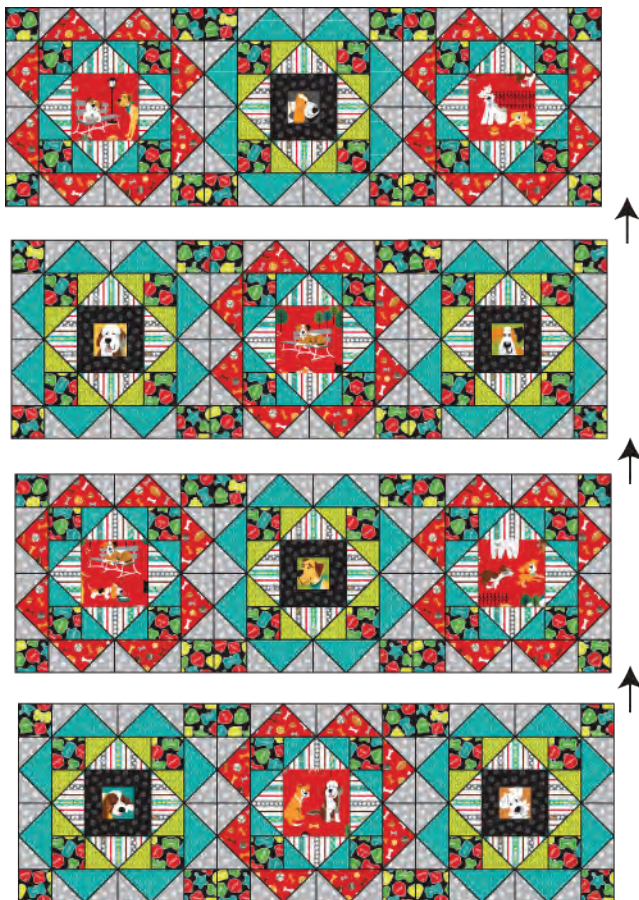

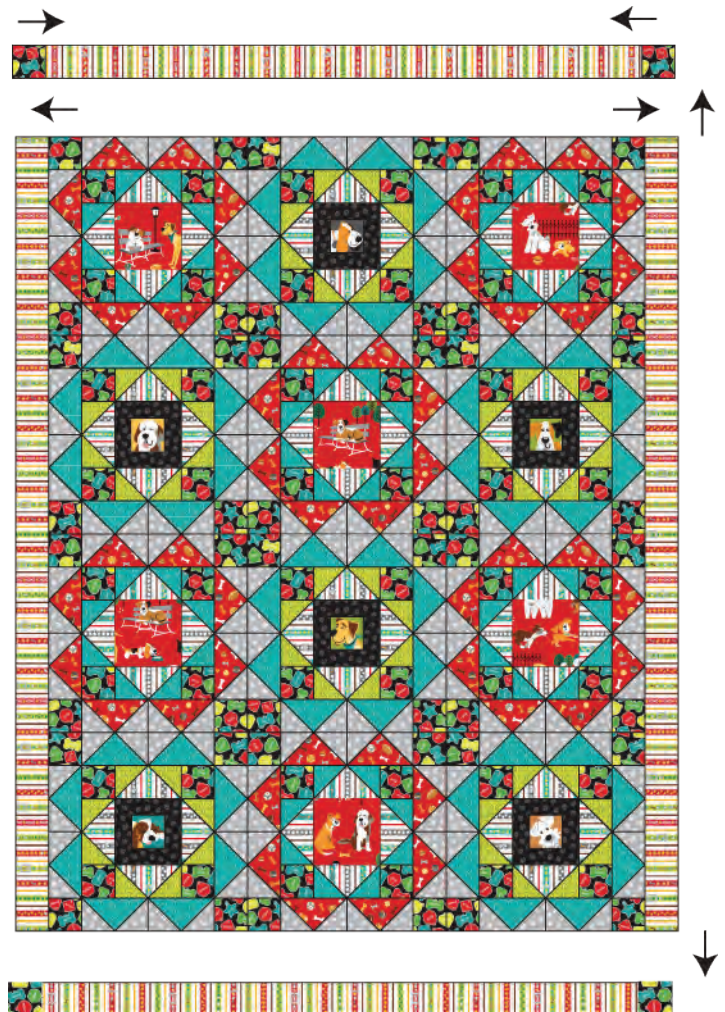

14. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top (Fig. 15).

15. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top (Fig. 16).

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

16. Press the quilt top and 62" x 74" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

17. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

18. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
