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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3588-02 Balloon Hearts - White/Pink), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8 ½" squares.

Fabric B (3590-82 Diamond Hearts - Red/Pink), cut:

• (1) 4 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 \%" squares.

Fabric C (3591-28 Sentiments - Pink/Red), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric D (3592-08 Ladybugs - White/Red), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric E (3590-90 Diamond Hearts - Gray), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (3593-88 Arrows – Red), cut:

• (1) 4 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 \%" squares.

Fabric G (3594-02 Newsprint Hearts - White/Pink), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric H (3589-02 Rickrack Plaid - White/Pink), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric I (3595-88 Polka Dot - Red), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric J (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

• (2) 4 \%" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 \%" squares.

Backing (3588-88 Balloon Hearts - Red), cut:

• (2) 52" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 52" x 52" for the back.


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
Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly


1. Place (1) 4%" Fabric J square on top of (1) 4%" Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) Unit 1's (Fig. 3). Trim the units to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (16) Unit 1's total.



2. Repeat Step 1 using (4) 4 %" Fabric F squares and (4) 4 %" Fabric J squares to make (8) 4 %" Unit 2's (Fig. 4).



- 3. Sew (2) 2 ½" Fabric D squares and (2) 2 ½" Fabric C squares together to make (1) Unit 3 (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (16) Unit 3's total.
- 4. Sew (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D squares, (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square together to make (1) Unit 4 (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (8) Unit 4's total.



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- 5. Sew (1) Unit 1 to the top of (1) Unit 4. Sew this strip to the left side of (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) Unit 4 to the top of (1) Unit 1. Sew this strip to the right side of the Fabric A square (Fig. 7).
- 6. Sew (1) Unit 3, (1) Unit 1, (1) Unit 4 and (1) Unit 2 together, in that order. Sew this strip to the top of the Fabric A square (Fig. 7).
- 7. Sew (1) Unit 2, (1) Unit 4, (1) Unit 1 and (1) Unit 3 together, in that order. Sew this strip to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 7).
- 8. Repeat Steps 5-7 to make (4) Block Ones total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)


- 9. Sew the (4) Block Ones together in a (2) block by (2) block arrangement to make the Center Block.
- 10. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 11. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square to each end of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $36\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

12. Press the quilt top and $52" \times 52"$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 13. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 14. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
