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Cutting Instructions

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (2930-88 Book - Red), cut:

• Fussy cut (10) book panels, approximately 6 ½" x 6 ½".

Fabric B (2932-86 Dog Patch - Multi), cut:

• Fussy cut (10) dog squares, approximately 2 ½" x 2 ½".

Fabric C (2937-16 Tone on Tone - Turq.), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (20) 2" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 9 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (20) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric D (2936-88 Paw Prints - Red), cut:

- (2) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (10) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (40) triangles.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric E (1351-Brown Just Color! - Brown), cut:

- (2) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (10) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (40) triangles.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (120) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

• (10) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (160) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric G (2933-64 Dog Toys - Lime). cut:

• (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (80) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric H (2934-99 Dog Tags - Black), cut:

• (5) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (80) triangles.

Fabric I (2936-99 Paw Prints - Black), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (20) 2" x 2 ½" strips.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (20) 2" x 5 ½" strips.
- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut (2) 2" x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) 2" x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric J (2931-66 Dogs – Lime), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, and cut
- (2) 4 ½" x 59 ½" strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 63 ½" LOF strips.

Backing (2933-08 Dog Toys - White), cut:

• (2) 67" x WOF strips. Piece the strips and cut the 67" x 79" backing.

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Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A book panel. Sew (1) 2" x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A book panel (Fig. 1). Trim the block to 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Block One center. Repeat to make (10) Block One centers total.
- 2. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.



3. Place another 2 ½" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 5). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) EDE unit.









- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (40) EDE units total.
- 5. Follow Figure 6 and sew (4) 2 ½" Fabric E squares, (8) 2 ½" Fabric F squares, (4) EDE units and (1) Block One center together to make (1) Block One square. Repeat to make (10) Block One squares total.
- 6. Sew (2) Fabric H triangles, (1) Fabric E triangle and (1) Fabric D triangle together to make (1) Block Two side unit (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (40) Block Two side units total.
- 7. Sew (1) 2" x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square. Sew (1) 2" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B square (Fig. 8). Trim the block to measure 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Block Two centers total.



8. Sew (2) 2 ½" Fabric G squares and (2) 2 ½" Fabric F squares together to make (1) Block Two corner unit (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (40) Block Two corner units total.




9. Follow Figure 10 and sew (4) Block Two corner units, four Block Two side units and (1) Block Two center together to make (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make (10) Block Two squares total.




Quilt Top Assembly


10. Sew (2) Block Ones and (2) Block Twos together, alternating them, to make Row One (Fig. 11). Repeat to make Rows Three and Five.



11. Sew (2) Block Twos and (2) Block Ones together, alternating them, to make Row Two (Fig. 12). Repeat to make Row Four.



- 12. Sew the (5) rows together, in numerical order, to make the quilt top (Fig. 13).
- 13. Sew (1) $2" \times 60 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric I strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $2" \times 51 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top (Fig. 14).



14. Sew (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top (Fig. 15).



Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 67" x 79" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 16. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
