Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated.

Cutting is the same for each version of the quilt:

From Fabric A:

1. Use template plastic to cut one 6 1/2" square for Block #1 and one 6 3/4" square for Block #2. Trace and cut ten 6 1/2" squares for Block #1 using the area of the fabric with the smaller floral print. Trace and cut ten 6 3/4" squares for Block #2 positioning template as a diamond (on a 45-degree angle). Use the area of the fabric with the larger floral print for Block #2. Try to highlight various areas of the fabric within each shape to create variety. It's OK to use the area of fabric where the scale of the print transitions to the next size. (Block Center)

From Fabric B:

1. Cut six 2 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 2 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips and two 2 1/2" x 62 1/2" strips. (Middle Border)
2. Cut three 5 1/8" strips; subcut twenty 5 1/8" squares. Cut each square once diagonally in half to yield forty half-square triangles.

From Fabric C:

1. *From the length of the fabric (parallel to selvages)*, cut two 6 1/2" x 66 1/2" strips. (Side Outer Border)
2. From the remaining width of fabric, cut six 6 1/2" strips (*perpendicular to selvege*). Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 6 1/2" x 54 1/2" strips. (Top/bottom Outer Borders)

From Fabric D:

1. Cut nine 1 5/8" strips; subcut twenty 1 5/8" x 6 3/4" rectangles and twenty 1 5/8" x 9" rectangles.

From Fabric E:

1. Cut two 2" strips; subcut forty 2" squares. (Block #1)
2. Cut two 3 7/8" strips; subcut twenty 3 7/8" squares. Cut each square once diagonally in half to yield forty half-square triangles. (Block #1)
3. Cut one 3 1/2" strip; subcut eight 3 1/2" squares, four 2 1/2" squares and four 1 1/2" squares. (Border Squares)

- Cut ten 2" strips; subcut forty 2" x 5 3/8" half-trapezoids and forty 2" x 5 3/8" half-trapezoids reversed. Measure 5 3/8" from straight edge to tip of trapezoid. Refer to Figure 1 continuing to cut across strips in same pattern. (Block #2)

From Fabric F:

- Cut six 1 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips and two 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips. (Inner Border)
- Cut eight 2 1/2" strips. (Binding)

From Fabric G:

- Cut ten 2" strips; subcut forty 2" x 5 3/8" half-trapezoids and forty 2" x 5 3/8" half-trapezoids reversed. Measure 5 3/8" from straight edge to tip of trapezoid. Refer to Figure 1 continuing to cut across strips in same pattern. (Block #1)
- Cut two 2" strips; subcut forty 2" squares. (Block #2)
- Cut two 3 7/8" strips; subcut twenty 3 7/8" squares. Cut each square once diagonally in half to yield forty half-square triangles. (Block #2)
- Cut one 3 1/2" strip; subcut eight 3 1/2" squares. (Border Squares)

Piecing Instructions:

NOTE: The yellow quilt has been used for all diagrams. Refer to quilt images for placement of pieces for the pink and blue quilts.

Block #1:




Figure 2 Make 10.

- Sew one 5 1/8" B triangle to opposite sides of one 6 1/2" A square. Press toward the triangles. Sew one 5 1/8" B triangle to remaining sides of the square. Press toward the triangles. Repeat to make ten units (Figure 2).




Figure 3 Make 20.

- Sew one G trapezoid to the side of one 3 7/8" E triangle. Press toward the trapezoid. Repeat to make twenty units. (Figure 3).





Figure 4 Make 20.

- Sew one 2" E square to the end of one G reversed trapezoid. Press toward the trapezoid. Sew this unit to the top of the unit from step 2. Press toward the trapezoid. (Figure 4).

- Repeat steps 2 and 3 reversing placement of the trapezoids and reverse trapezoids. Make twenty units (Figure 5).

- Sew one unit from step 3 to opposite sides of the square-in-a-square unit from step 1. Press seams open.




Figure 6 Make 10.

Sew one unit from step 4 to the remaining sides of the step 1 unit. Press seams open. Repeat to make ten blocks (Figure 6).

Block #2:




Figure 7 Make 10.

- Sew one 1 5/8" x 6 3/4" D rectangle to opposite sides of a 6 3/4" A square. Press toward the rectangles. Sew one 1 5/8" x 9" D rectangle to the remaining sides of the A square. Press toward the rectangles. (Figure 7).
- Refer to steps 2-5 for Block #1. Use the remaining E trapezoids, reverse trapezoids and the G triangles and squares to create the rest of Block #2 (Figure 8).

Quilt Assembly:

- Refer to quilt diagram to lay blocks into five rows of four blocks each alternating Blocks #1 and #2 within rows and from row to row.
- Sew blocks into rows. Press seams open or in alternate directions from row to row. Sew rows together; press.
- Sew one 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" F strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders. Sew one 1 1/2" E square to both ends of both 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" F strips. Press toward the strips. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.
- Sew one 2 1/2" x 62 1/2" B strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders. Sew one 2 1/2" E square to both ends of both 2 1/2" x 50 1/2" B strips. Press toward the strips. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.
- Use the 3 1/2" E and G squares to make four four-patch units (Figure 9). Press.




6. Sew one 6 1/2" x 66 1/2" C strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders. Referring to quilt diagram for correct position, sew one four-patch unit to both ends of both 6 1/2" x 54 1/2" C strips. Press toward the strips. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

2. Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Trim layers even with top.
5. Join eight 2 1/2" F binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together to make double-fold binding. Sew binding to quilt using your favorite method.
6. Make a label and sew to back of the quilt.

Finishing:

1. Prepare backing using two widths of fabric and a vertical seam. Press seam open.


