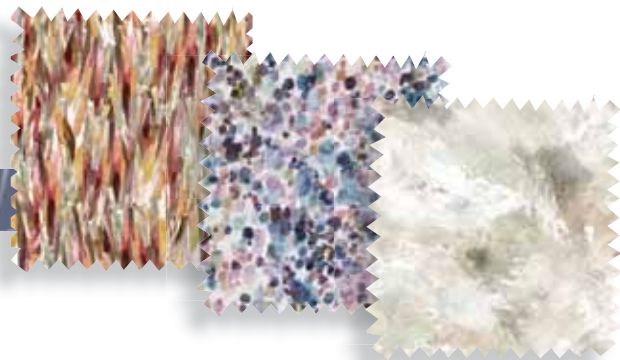
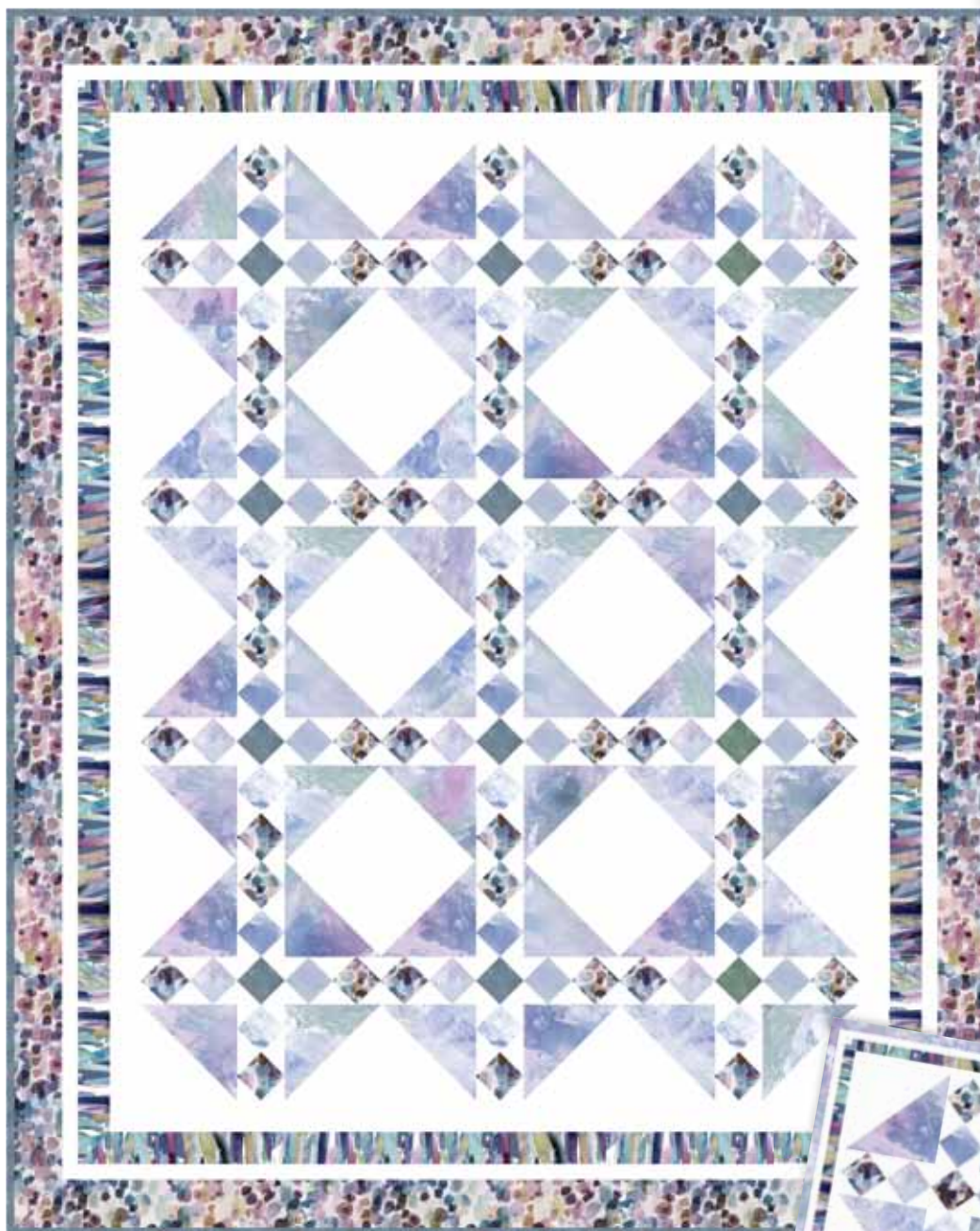

## Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvages) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

**Note:** This quilt was designed to have the least number of seams leaving large, flat open areas for quilting. Pieced sashing is made with extra large white triangles and sashing is trimmed to correct size. This will produce an accurate pieced sashing.

### From Fabric A:

1. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 2 1/2" x 59" strips and two 2 1/2" x 74" strips. (Second Border)

### From Fabric B:

1. Cut four 2 5/8" strips; subcut forty-eight 2 5/8" squares. (Pieced Sashing)
2. Cut nine 4 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 4 1/2" x 69" strips and two 4 1/2" x 84" strips. (Outer Border)

### From Fabric C:

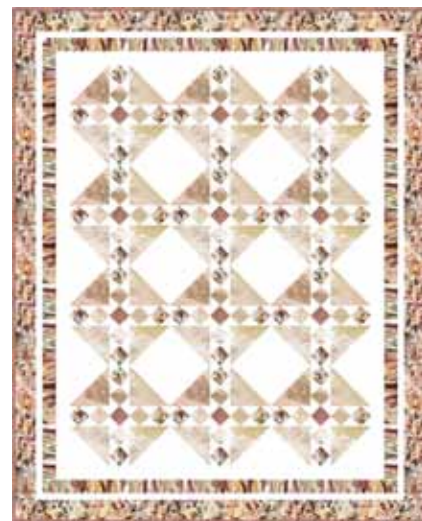
1. Cut four 2 5/8" strips; subcut forty-eight 2 5/8" squares. (Pieced Sashing)
2. Cut five 6 7/8" strips; subcut twenty-four 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield forty-eight half-square triangles. (Blocks)

### From Fabric D:

1. Cut one 2 5/8" strip; subcut twelve 2 5/8" squares. (Pieced Sashing)
2. Cut eight 2 1/2" strips. (Binding)

### From Fabric E:

1. Cut three 2 3/4" strips; subcut thirty-eight 2 3/4" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield seventy-six half-square triangles. (Pieced Sashing)
2. Cut six 4 1/2" strips; subcut forty-five 4 1/2" squares. Cut each square diagonally in both directions to yield one hundred seventy-eight quarter-square triangles. (Pieced Sashing)
3. Cut two 9" strips; subcut six 9" squares. (Blocks)
4. From remainder of 9" strip, cut two 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield four half-square triangles. (Corner Setting Triangles)



5. Cut one 13 1/4" strip; subcut three 13 1/4" squares. Cut each square diagonally in both directions to yield twelve quarter-square triangles. You will only use ten triangles. (Side Setting Triangles)
6. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 2 1/2" x 55" strips and two 2 1/2" x 70" strips. (First Border)
7. Cut seven 1 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1 1/2" x 61" strips and two 1 1/2" x 76" strips. (Third Border)

## Piecing Instructions:

**Note: Blue colorway is used in diagrams.**

1. Sew one 6 7/8" C triangle to opposite sides of one 9" E square. Press toward the triangles. Repeat for remaining sides of square (Figure 1). Repeat to make six square-in-a-square blocks.

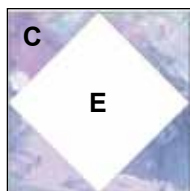

2. Sew one 6 7/8" C triangle to both sides of one 13 1/4" E triangle as shown. Press seams toward the C triangles (Figure 2). Repeat to make ten Flying Geese units.

3. Sew one 6 7/8" C triangle to one 6 7/8" E triangle. Press toward the C triangle (Figure 3). Repeat to make four half-square triangle units.

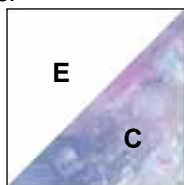

4. Sew one 4 1/2" E triangle to one 2 5/8" B square matching corners. Press toward the B square. Sew one 4 1/2" E triangle to one 2 5/8" C square matching corners. Press toward the C square.

**Note: the E triangles are cut larger and won't fit perfectly at this point.** Sew these two units together as shown (Figure 4). Press seam open. Repeat to make fourteen units.

5. Sew one 2 3/4" E triangle to each corner of the unit, matching center of side of square with center point of long side of triangle. Press toward the triangles. To trim unit: align 1/4" line on your rotary ruler with points of squares. Trim four sides of unit to measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" (Figure 5). Repeat to make six units.
6. Repeat process used in steps 4 & 5 but use two 2 5/8" B squares, two 2 5/8" C squares, six 4 1/2" E triangles and four 2 3/4" E triangles (Figure 6). Trim four sides of unit to measure 3 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make nine units.

7. Using same process, sew together six 2 5/8" B squares, six 2 5/8" C squares, three 2 5/8" D squares, twenty-eight 4 1/2" E triangles and four 2 3/4" E triangles. Trim sashing to 3 1/2" x 45 1/2" (Figure 7). It is easiest to trim this long sashing by using a shorter ruler (12" works well) and trim sections, moving ruler as needed. Repeat to make four horizontal sashing rows.



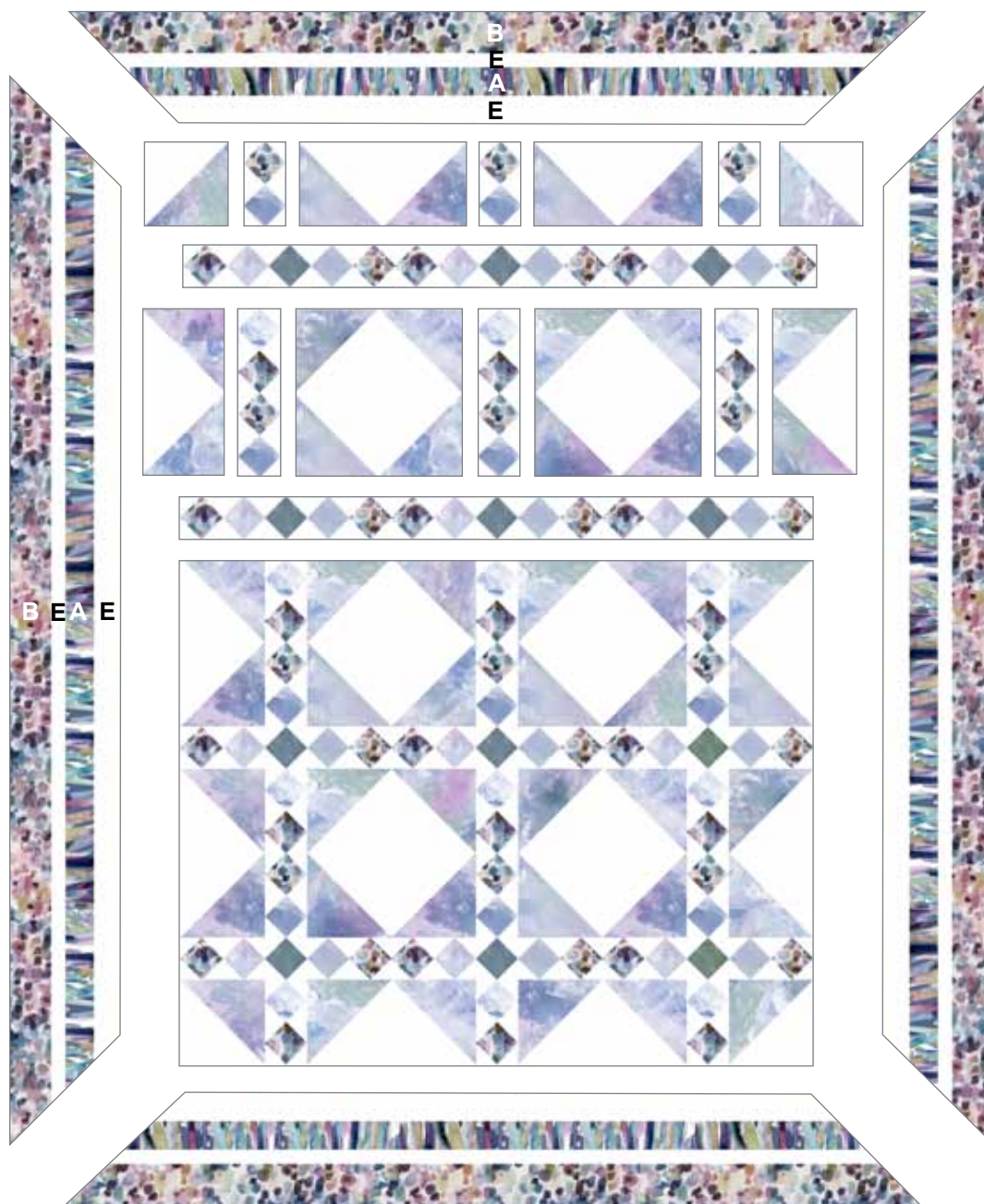

## Quilt Assembly:

1. Refer to the quilt diagram to lay out the blocks and units from above. Sew the blocks, setting units and vertical sashing units together into five horizontal rows. Press away from the sashing.
2. Sew horizontal sashing between block rows and press away from the sashing.
3. Center and sew one 2 1/2" x 70" E strip to one 2 1/2" x 74" A strip. Center and sew one 1 1/2" x 76" E strip to the A strip. Center and sew one 4 1/2" x 84" B strip to the 1 1/2" E strip. Press all seams toward the outer B strip. Repeat for second side border.
4. Center and sew one 2 1/2" x 55" E strip to one 2 1/2" x 59" A strip. Center and sew one 1 1/2" x 61" E strip to the A strip. Center and sew one 4 1/2" x 69" B strip to the 1 1/2" E strip. Press all seams away from the outer B strip. Repeat for second top/bottom border.
5. Center side borders to side of quilt. Ends extend beyond edge of quilt. Begin and end sewing a healthy 1/4" (a few threads deeper than 1/4") from both ends of quilt. Repeat to sew top/bottom borders to quilt. Press seams toward the borders.
6. Close border corners with mitered seams. Because side and top/bottom border seams were pressed in opposite directions, these seams should "lock" together when aligning borders. Trim seams to 1/2" and press open.

## Finishing:

1. Prepare backing using two widths with a vertical seam. Press seam open. Trim to 72" x 88".
2. Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Trim layers even with quilt top, squaring corners.
5. This quilt was designed with 3" finished borders. These outer borders were cut across the width of the fabric and therefore may stretch a bit in the quilting process. The borders were cut wider to allow for this. After quilting, trim borders 3 1/4" away from seam, squaring corners.
6. Prepare binding using 2 1/2" D strips and diagonal seams. Press seams open. Sew binding to quilt using your preferred method.
7. Make a label and sew to back of the quilt.

## Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvages) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

**Note:** Pieced sashing is made with extra large white triangles and sashing is trimmed to correct size. This will produce an accurate pieced sashing.

### From Fabric A:

1. Cut two 1 1/4" strips. Cut both strips in half to yield four 1 1/4" x 21" (approximately) strips. (Second Border)

### From Fabric B:

1. Cut one 2 5/8" strip; subcut five 2 5/8" squares. (Sashing)

### From Fabric C:

1. Cut one 6 7/8" strip; subcut two 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield four half-square triangles. (Block)
2. Use remainder of 6 7/8" strip to cut four 2 5/8" squares. (Sashing)
3. Cut four 1 1/4" strips; subcut four 1 1/4" x 25" strips. (Outer Border)

### From Fabric D:

1. Cut one 6 7/8" strip; subcut two 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield four half-square triangles. (Block)
2. Use remainder of 6 7/8" strip to cut four 4 1/2" squares. Cut each square diagonally in both directions to yield twelve quarter-square triangles. (Sashing)
3. Cut one 2 3/4" strip; subcut six 2 3/4" squares. Cut each square diagonally in half to yield twelve half-square triangles. (Sashing)
4. Cut two 1" strips. Cut both strips in half to yield four 1" x 21" (approximately) strips. (First Border)
5. Cut four 1" strips; subcut four 1" x 23" strips. (Third Border)

### Backing:

1. Cut one 20" strip; subcut two 16" x 20" rectangles.



## Piecing Instructions:

**Note: Blue colorway is used in diagrams.**

1. Sew one  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " C triangle to one  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " D triangle (Figure 1). Press toward the C triangle. Repeat to make four units.

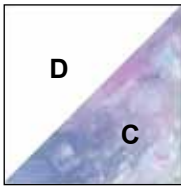

2. Sew one  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " D triangle to one  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " B square matching corners. Press toward the B square. Sew one  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " D triangle to one  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " C square matching corners. Press toward the C square. **Note:** the D triangles are cut larger and won't fit perfectly at this point. Sew these two units together as shown. Press seam open. Repeat to make two units.

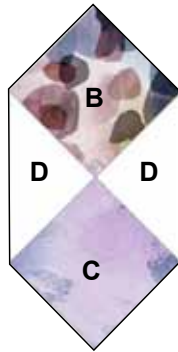

3. Sew one  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " D triangle to each corner of the unit, matching center of side of square with center point of long side of triangle (Figure 3). Press toward the triangles. To trim unit: align  $\frac{1}{4}$ " line on your rotary ruler with points of squares. Trim four sides of unit to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make two units.

4. Repeat process used in steps 4 and 5 but use three  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " B squares, two  $2\frac{5}{8}$ " C squares, eight  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " D triangles and four  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " D triangles (Figure 4). Trim four sides of unit to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $15\frac{1}{2}$ ".

5. Refer to Figure 5 to lay out the units from step 1 and sashing units above. Sew the units into three horizontal rows. Press away from the sashing. Sew rows together and press seams open or to one side.

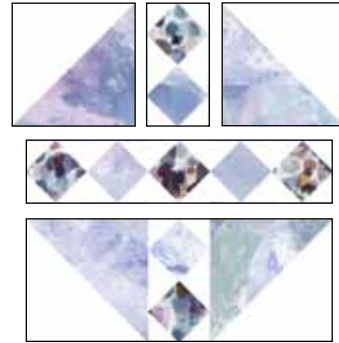

6. Center and sew one  $1$ " x  $21$ " D strip to one  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $21$ " A strip. Center and sew one  $1$ " x  $23$ " D strip to the A strip. Center and sew one  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $25$ " C strip to the just sewn D strip. Press all seams toward the outer C strip. Repeat for second side border.
7. Repeat step 6 except press away from the outer C strip. Repeat for second top/bottom border.
8. Center side borders to pillow front. Ends extend beyond edge of pillow. Begin and end sewing a healthy  $\frac{1}{4}$ " (a few threads deeper than  $\frac{1}{4}$ ") from both ends of pillow front. Repeat to sew top/bottom borders to pillow. Press seams toward the borders.
9. Close border corners with mitered seams (Figure 6). Because you pressed sides and top/bottom border seams in opposite directions, these seams should "lock" together when aligning borders. Trim seams to  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and press open.

## Finishing:

1. Sew a double  $\frac{1}{2}$ " hem on one long side of each  $16$ " x  $20$ " backing rectangle. With right sides together, place backing rectangles on top of pillow front matching corners. Backing pieces will overlap.
2. Sew around all sides of pillow. Trim corners to reduce bulk, if necessary. Turn right side out and press.
3. Insert pillow form and enjoy!

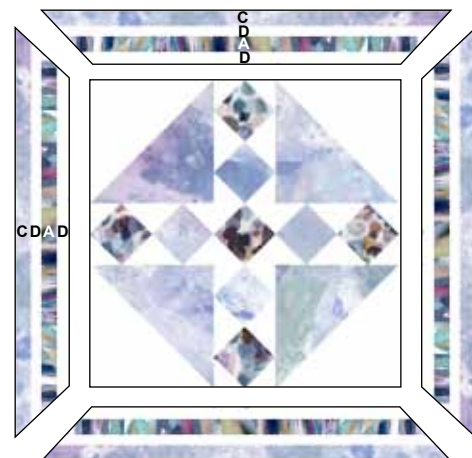

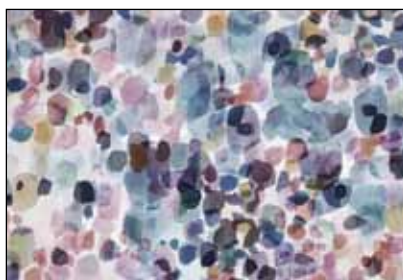

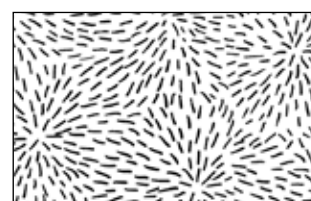
