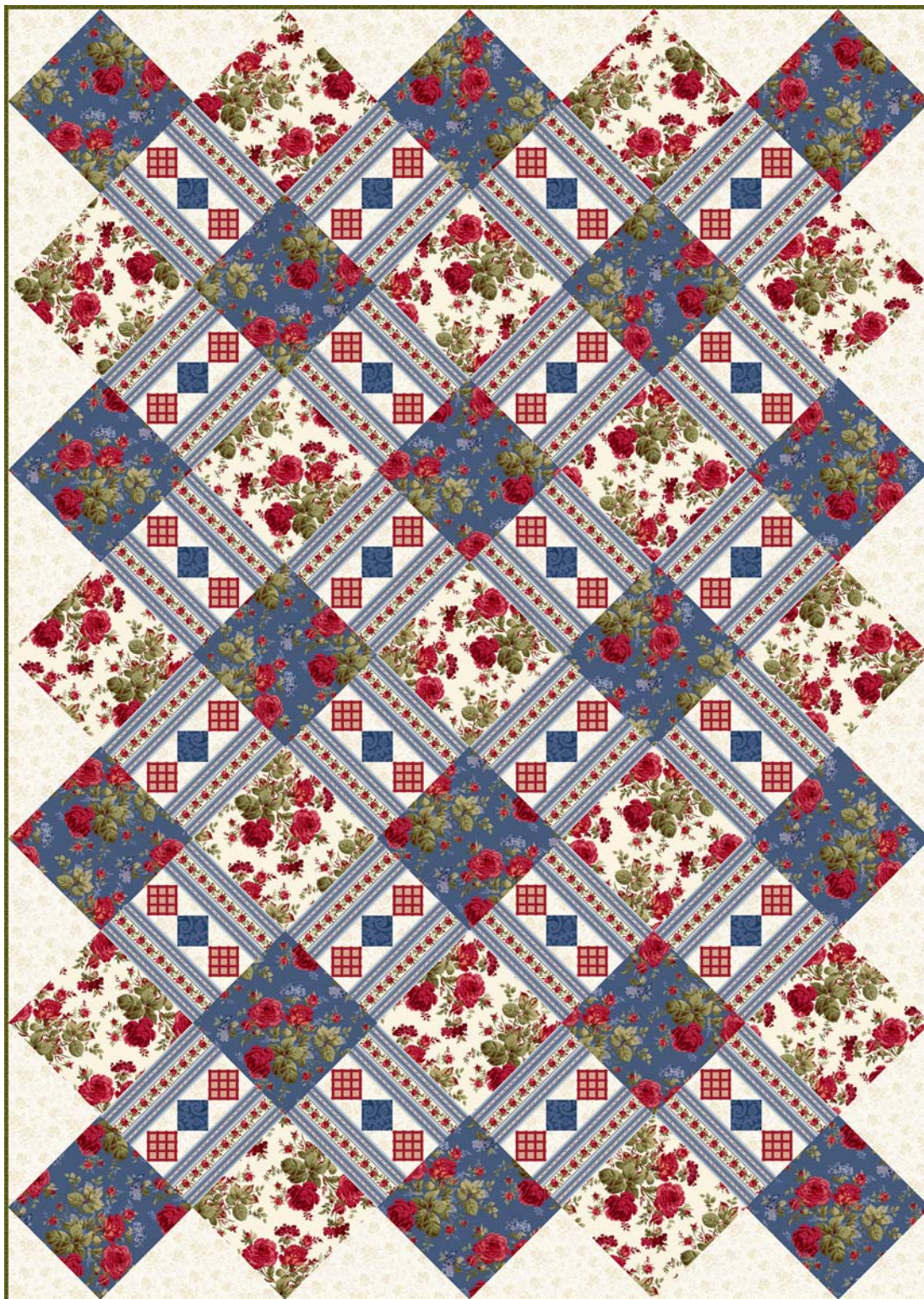


Red and Blue...and Roses, Too!

Lattice Quilt



Approx 64" x 89"

Fabric Requirements & Cutting Instructions

Fabric A- Large Floral – Blue **8393-0510** **1 1/2 yards**
 Cut five 9 1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut the strips into eighteen 9 1/2" squares.

Fabric B- Large Floral – Cream **8393-0511** **1 1/2 yards**
 Cut five 9 1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut the strips into seventeen 9 1/2" squares.

Fabric C- Buds – Cream **8398-0592** **1 7/8 yards**
 Cut two 14" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into five 14" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make twenty side-setting triangles.
 Cut one 7 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strips into two 7 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across one diagonal to make four corner-setting triangles.
 Cut fourteen 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (288) 2" squares.

Fabric D- Stripe – Blue **8394-0510** **1 3/4 yards**
 Fussy cut forty-eight 9 1/2" x 3 1/2" LOF strips, each centered on a strip of cream roses.

Fabric E- Paisley – Blue **8400-0510** **1/4 yard**
 Cut two 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 3 1/2" squares.

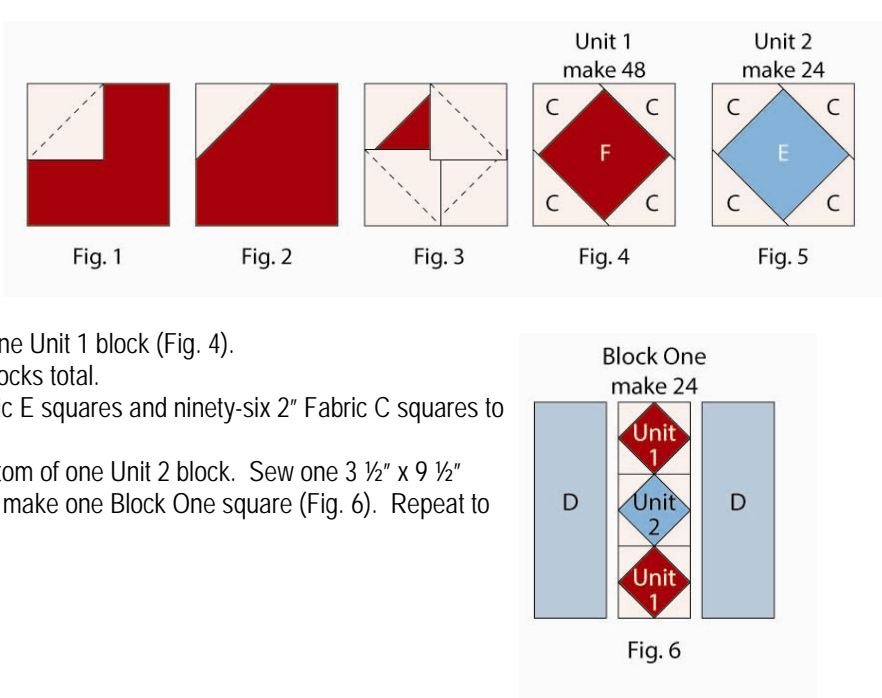
Fabric F- Tiles – Red **8399-0511** **3/4 yard**
 Fussy cut forty-eight 3 1/2" squares, each centered on a red block.

Fabric G- Leaves – Green **8396-0514** **2/3 yard**
 Cut eight 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing- Buds – Red/Cream **8398-0511** **5 yards**
 Cut two 88" x WOF strips. Sew together and trim to make one 82" x 88" back.

Block Assembly

- Place one 2" Fabric C square on the top left corner of one 3 1/2" Fabric F square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
- Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the 3 1/2" Fabric F square to make one Unit 1 block (Fig. 4).
- Repeat Steps 1-2 to make forty-eight Unit 1 blocks total.
- Repeat Steps 1-2 using twenty-four 3 1/2" Fabric E squares and ninety-six 2" Fabric C squares to make twenty-four Unit 2 blocks (Fig. 5).
- Sew one Unit 1 block to the top and to the bottom of one Unit 2 block. Sew one 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the sewn strip to make one Block One square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make twenty-four Block One squares total.

Quilt Assembly (refer to the quilt layout while assembling the quilt top)

(Pay attention to the orientation of the Blocks when constructing the Center Block.)

6. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to opposite sides of one 9 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew one Fabric C corner-setting triangle to the top of the Fabric A square to make Row One.
7. Sew one 9 1/2" Fabric B square to each side of one Block One square. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to each end of the new strip to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Ten.
8. Sew three 9 1/2" Fabric A squares and two Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to each end of the new strip to make Row Three. Repeat to make Row Nine.
9. Sew four 9 1/2" Fabric B squares and three Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to each end of the sewn strip to make Row Four. Repeat to make Row Eight.
10. Sew five 9 1/2" Fabric A squares and four Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to the left end of the new strip and one Fabric C corner-setting triangle to the right end of the strip to make Row Five.
11. Sew five 9 1/2" Fabric B squares and four Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to each end of the sewn strip to make Row Six.
12. Sew five 9 1/2" Fabric A squares and four Block One squares together, alternating them. Sew one Fabric C corner-setting triangle to the left end of the new strip and one Fabric C side-setting triangle to the right end of the strip to make Row Seven.
13. Sew one Fabric C side-setting triangle to opposite sides of one 9 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew one Fabric C corner-setting triangle to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make Row Eleven.
14. Sew the eleven rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block.
15. Trim the Center Block to measure 63 3/4" x 89" to make the quilt top.
16. Layer and quilt as desired.
17. Sew the eight 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45° seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half, lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press.
18. Bind as desired.
